Item 1. Call to Order.

There being a quorum present, Chairman Schulze called the meeting to order.

Chairman Schulze stated that the election for Chair and Vice-Chair for the MUSC Board of Trustees was held during the MUHA Board of Trustees meeting as these positions serve as the chair and vice-chair of both the MUHA and MUSC Board of Trustees.

Item 7. Institutional Advancement Report.

Ms. Kate Azizi, Vice President for Institutional Advancement, reported that as of June 30, 2020, MUSC closed with \$88,228,899 in new gifts and pledges, nearly 40% over its goal of \$63,143,000 and

79% over last year. MUSC had over 8,000 donors supporting many different areas. COVID-19 fundraising efforts were over \$2 million from about 783 gifts. Development's FY21 strategic planning efforts include; 1) increase funds raised and increase number of donors; 2) help our team be more efficient and happier; 3) enhance stewardship of donors; and, 4) have a bigger impact on education, research, and clinical care.

Item 8. Report of the Office of Research.

Dr. Patrick Flume, Associate Provost for Research, gave an update on COVID-19 research activities and research funding. Dr. Flume reported that early into the pandemic, a committee was established to vet clinical trials that they thought would be the best fit for our patients and what was thought to have the greatest opportunity for success. The committee looked at 301 different research opportunities. Dr. Flume gave an overview of the current COVID trials being used across the health spectrum. Dr. Flume announced that MUSC will be participating in the AstraZeneca vaccine study with the intent to enroll 1500 patients over the next two months to contribute to the total 30,000 patients. On the research funding update, he reported that they initially anticipated more than a 50% reduction in revenues; however, 2020 revenues have been equivalent or even better than they have been in the last few years and the return on awards increased from 27% to 42%. He commented that they have not realized the final impact of COVID on clinical trials as revenues typically lag. The vaccine study will help make a big difference.

Item 10. Provost Report.

Dr. Lisa Saladin, Provost, introduced the new SGA President, Joy Kirkpatrick, who is a second-year student in the MUSC DMD joint PhD program. Ms. Kirkpatrick stated that she is excited to serve as the voice of the students during one of the most challenging times in MUSC history. She mentioned an initiative of the SGA has been the implementation of the first SGA virtual comment box for students to submit concerns/questions online. She also reported that the SGA continues to encourage students and serves as role models to follow the university COVID-19 directives.

Dr. Saladin announced that MUSC's PA program was recently approved by its accrediting body for a permanent increase in its class sizes from 60 to 97. Dr. Saladin also commented that at this same time MUSC was notified around this time that Lenoir-Rhyne University was closing its PA program. Dr. Saladin applauded MUSC's PA Director, Dr. Helen Martin and her team for getting this accreditation within one week to expand the class size which enabled MUSC to accept 36 students from Lenoir-Rhyne.

Dr. Saladin gave a brief report on MUSC's academic plan around COVID-19 that was recently distributed. Dr. Saladin commented that for the most part, learning will be a hybrid model with 50% of course content will be face to face and the rest. She also shared some of the prevention and protection measures in place to keep MUSC students, staff and faculty safe.

Item 12. MUSC Financial Report.

Mr. Patrick Wamsley, Chief Financial Officer, presented the June 30, 2020 interim financials and reported that MUSC ended FY20 with 145 days of operating cash. Mr. Wamsley noted that the original FY20 budget had a budgeted fund bottom-line of \$9.1 million and the actual year-end budgeted funds margin was \$5.2 million. The operating revenue was unfavorable at \$5.6M; however, the operating expenses were a favorable 23M due to a reduction in spending/expenditures.

Ms. Eva Greenwood, Chief Financial Officer, presented the June 30, 2020, interim financials. Ms. Greenwood reported 226 days cash on hand and an operating margin of \$17M. Operating revenue was \$632M with operating expenses of \$616M. The year-end projected net margin is \$10.5M. .

Item 17. Diversity and Inclusion Update.

Dr. Willette Williams, Chief Diversity Officer, gave an update on activities in response to COVID-19 and local and national events related to social injustice, racism and community unrest. This included hosting several virtual workforce forums to support students and employees across the Enterprise. Additionally, the Office of Training and Intercultural Education and the Office of Student Programs and Student Diversity collaborated to present the Community Healing Spaces: Diversity and Self-Care Series. Over the course of 6 weeks, interactive lectures, seminars and support spaces were created via a virtual learning community. The sessions were well attended by faculty, staff and care team members as well. The Office of Training and Intercultural Education will have engaged nearly 1300 MUSC community members between March-August 2020 and remains committed to enhancing diversity and inclusion education and professional development to ensure every member of the MUSC community develops an appreciation for the richness that our diversity brings and demonstrates a commitment to our culture of inclusion.

Mr. Quentin Tompkins, Government Relations Manager, gave an update on the state-wide rural community testing sites. Mr. Tompkins commented that people in other parts of the state really didn't see MUSC as anything other than a hospital in Charleston; however, with these rural testing sites we have done a great job of educating folks about MUSC and what we are for the citizens of South Carolina and the country. Besides the permanent sites in West Ashley, downtown Charleston and Lancaster, mobile testing sites have been set up in 35 of the 46 counties throughout South Carolina approaching a total of 300 testing events. MUSC will continue to go around to any and every community that we can access to set up these testing sites. Mr. Tompkins commented that during this time, MUSC has built a lot of strong relationships with some of the local communities and feels that over these past few months they are much stronger than they were before. He also commented that MUSC's brand is probably as strong as it's ever been due to COVID.
