Statement of Revenues, Expenses and Changes in Net Assets: YTD August 31, 2021 (Unaudited) Actuals Compared to Fixed Budget

Revenue Explanation: August year-to-date adjusted discharges were favorable to budget by 1.1%. Inpatient surgeries, outpatient surgeries, transplant procedures, and Case Mix Index were favorable or (unfavorable) to budget by (6.6%), (2.5%), (12.8%), and 1.8%, respectively. Length of Stay was \$0.1M favorable to budget and Payor Mix Index was unfavorable \$4.3M. Retail pharmacy revenues were favorable by \$14.3M. Other Revenues were \$0.2M unfavorable to budget. Charity care and bad debt expenses were \$7.2M unfavorable to budget.

Expense Explanation: FTE per Adjusted Occupied Bed – Case Mix Adjusted was favorable to budget by 9.3%, which equates to 721 FTEs less or \$11.3M. The salary rate variance is negatively impacted by \$5.5M due to COVID, agency utilization, overtime, and nursing incentive pay.

Purchased Services was favorable to budget \$12.9M due to maintenance contracts and other contractual services.

Physician Services was favorable to budget \$0.3M due to the timing of expenses related to the College of Medicine.

Pharmaceuticals, not explained by volume, was favorable to budget by \$2.4M for the year. Retail pharmacy revenues, net of expenses, were favorable by \$9.1M on a year-to-date basis.

Medical Supplies and Other Supplies, not explained by volume, were \$4.1M unfavorable to budget year-to-date.

Insurance was unfavorable by \$0.1M, while Leases and Other were favorable by \$0.2M.

Discharges were favorable by 110, Inpatient Surgeries were unfavorable by 39, Outpatient Surgeries were favorable by 62, Heart Procedures were favorable by 29 and Post-Acute Patient Days were favorable by 147.

Expense Explanation: Salary expense was unfavorable by \$0.4M. FTE per Adjusted Occupied Bed – Case Mix Adjusted was unfavorable to budget by 13%. Benefit expenses were unfavorable by \$0.3M to the budget due to annual increases in health insurance.

Purchased Services expenses were unfavorable to budget by \$0.3M year-to-date due to increased facilities projects.

Statement of Revenues, Expenses and Changes in Net Assets: YTD August 31, 2021 (Unaudited) Actuals Compared to Fixed Budget

Revenue Explanation: August year-to-date net patient revenues were unfavorable by 8.0% or \$2.4M. Adjusted discharges were unfavorable to budget by 15.1%. Inpatient surgeries, outpatient surgeries and heart procedures were unfavorable to budget by 47.1%, 4.9%, and 37.6% respectively. Specifically, IP surgery and heart procedures created an unfavorable variance of \$1.7M and \$0.6M respectively. Overall volume shortfalls above drove an unfavorable variance to NR of \$2.5M, with all other areas including payer mix driving a net favorable variance of \$0.1M.

Expense Explanation: Salaries and Wages were unfavorable to budget \$0.6M driven by assumption of employee PTO liability of \$3.2M. Lower volumes drove lower salary and wages costs to budget. In addition, postponed anticipated salary increases provided a favorable variance to budget. Benefits were favorable \$2.5M mainly due pension actuarial avoidance of \$1.1M, lower salary and wages, and increased contract labor.

One Time Acquisition Costs were unfavorable to budget \$0.5M.

Purchased Services were unfavorable by \$0.9M due to budget alignment of \$0.8M with physician services. Large expenses for month include lease agreement CAM expenses, MAC fees, Siemens equipment support and Anesthesia fees.

Physician Services were favorable \$1.0M due to budget alignment of \$0.8M with purchased services.

Pharmaceuticals were unfavorable to budget \$0.8M due to higher COVID and oncology drugs costs.

Medical and Other Supplies were favorable by \$1.1M driven by lower volume.

Utilities, Insurance, Leases, and Other Expenses were \$0.5M favorable to budget due to lower facility expenses.

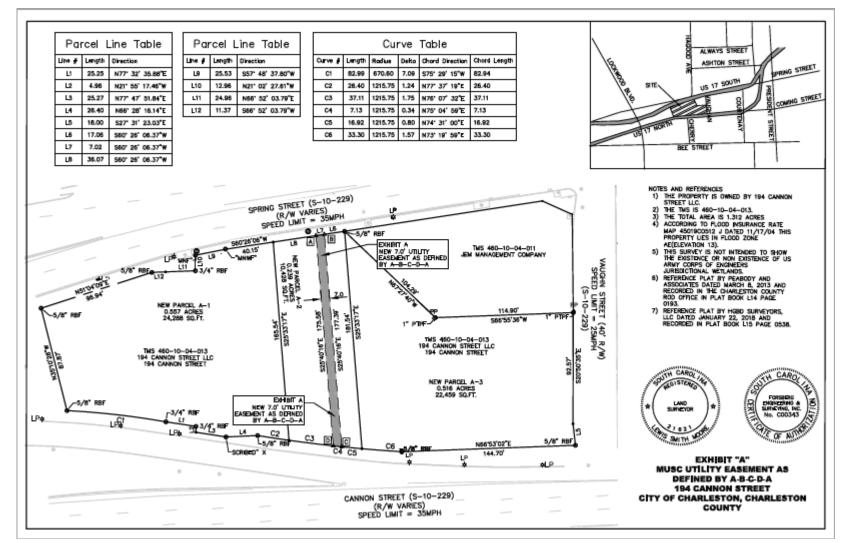

SCOPE OF WORK: Project will construct a six story, approximately 75,000 gross square foot building on President Street directly north of the Bioengineering building. The bottom four floors will be finished for current occupancy, the top two floors will be shell space for future College of Health Professions expansion. The building will include 5000 square feet of research space, a 6000 square foot auditorium, and faculty and staff office and support space. An elevated pedestrian bridge is included connecting to the 2nd floor of the existing Bioengineering building.

JUSTIFICATION: The College of Health Professions has taken action to increase overall student numbers by 20% by FY24 in response to a projected healthcare workforce shortage in South Carolina and MUSC Board of Trustees directive in Fall 2018 for academic growth across programs expected to face this deficiency. The following table shows the positive growth trend over the past few years. We expect this number to continue to increase over the next few years, which will more than exceed our 20% proposed growth in student numbers.

Note 8. Summary of Net Position

The University implemented GASB Statement No. 68, *Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions* in fiscal year 2015 and GASB Statement No. 75, *Accounting and Financial Reporting for Post Employment Benefits Other Than Pensions (OPEB)* in fiscal year 2018. These statements require participating employers to report their proportionate share of the plans' net pension liability and OPEB liabilities, pension and OPEB expense and deferred outflows and inflows. In fiscal year 2020, excluding the GASB 68 and GASB 75 impact, the University's unrestricted net position decreased \$7.1 million for a total of \$158.3 million. In fiscal year 2019, excluding the GASB 68 and GASB 75 impact, the University's net position increased \$28.2 million for a total of \$165.4 million. In fiscal year 2018, excluding the GASB 68 and GASB 75 impact, the University's unrestricted net position increased \$0.6 million for at total of \$137.2 million. In fiscal year 2017, excluding the GASB 68 impact, the University's unrestricted net position increased \$10.5 million for a total of \$136.7 million.

2021 - 2022

OVERVIEW:

The Medical University of South Carolina Health System (MUSC Health) is committed to fostering an environment that promotes high quality care in all its domains: safe, timely, effective, equitable, efficient, and patient centered, in all locations of care. This commitment has developed into an institutional strategy that aligns governance, managerial and clinical support functions and personnel to continually assess our performance and proactively identify opportunities for enhancing quality and safety.

MUSC is comprised of 6 Colleges, MUSC-Physicians (practice plan), the MUSC Medical Center (or Medical University Hospital Authority, MUHA), 7 community hospitals, joint ventures, and affiliate partners. The MUSC Health clinical enterprise consists of all entities that are directly related to providing patient care. *This plan focuses specifically on the MUSC Health – Charleston Division*.

This Quality and Performance Improvement (QAPI) Plan establishes the framework and structure for continually and systematically planning, designing, measuring, assessing and improving performance of system-wide key functions and processes that support high quality and safe patient care within the MUSC Health clinical enterprise. Central components of this network are as follows:

- Incorporate quality and safety planning throughout the enterprise;
- Create an organizational structure that allows units to integrate their improvement efforts and collaborate across unit and departmental boundaries;
- Communicate improvement efforts throughout the enterprise to foster institutional learning and encourage innovation and problem-solving at the unit level;
- Assure project prioritization, process design and redesign are consistent with the mission, vision and values;
- Foster institutional self-assessment exercises that benchmark our performance against best practices in all facets of quality and safety;
- Promote evidence-based practice and high value care in all we do;
- Integrate error reduction and reliability procedures in all healthcare processes;
- Integrate the utilization of performance improvement principles in the daily activities of the work place;
- Integrate the principles of High Reliability in all we do;
- Continuously enhance a Culture of Safety (Just Culture, Learning Culture, and Reporting Culture), continuous learning, and leadership engagement in all areas (components of High Reliability; Appendix B);
- Link the education of our students, trainees, and care team members to the science of quality and safety;
- Foster and support innovative approaches to enhance quality and safety;

- Enhance interprofessional team training and team work;
- Foster patient engagement as a safety strategy;
- Encourage provider wellness and safety programs as a safety strategy;
- Foster research and implementation science that critically examines how to improve quality and safety.

ORGANIZATIONAL VALUES:

The clinical enterprise relies upon a core set of values to achieve its stated mission. These values are as follows:

Compassion Teamwork Diversity Accountability Innovation

QUALITY DEFINITION:

The clinical enterprise adopts the Institute of Medicine's definition of quality which is "the degree to which health services for individuals and populations increase the likelihood of desired health outcomes and are consistent with current professional knowledge". All domains of quality as noted by the IOM are adopted: safe, timely, effective, efficient, equitable, and patient-centered.

ORGANIZATIONAL QUALITY REVIEW GOVERNANCE:

Quality and Safety is an interdisciplinary structure that drives and coordinates all improvement activities of the domains of quality within the enterprise. This structure represents a systematic organization-wide approach to planning for quality results. Through various committees and communication channels, improvement efforts are identified, prioritized, and quantified.

In general, there are two types of performance improvement projects. The first are the large-scale, organization-wide performance improvement projects. These projects are initiated by senior management to support key strategic and operational objectives. The second types of projects are the smaller-scale, service projects. These smaller projects are initiated from within any component of the organization and are reported in the component's operational committees. When organization-wide projects are launched or completed, project milestones are approved by the Quality Executive Committee (QEC), comprised of ICCE and senior leadership. Project progress is monitored/reported to the Quality IMPROVE committee, comprised of leaders from quality, performance improvement, ICCE units, and strategic partners.

The full quality agenda is monitored extensively by the QEC and the MEC. The QEC agenda is separated into 4 sections:

- 1. Event Reviews
- 2. IMPROVE projects
- 3. QAPI Reports
- 4. Strategic quality area reports

Event Reviews

All significant events are investigated by MUSC Health risk-safety team, by means of a thorough and credible Root Cause Analysis (RCA) to determine whether the events are deemed a sentinel or serious safety event as defined in MUHA policy C-49. All event action plans are reviewed and approved by both the MEC and QEC. All action plans are assigned a champion, a process owner, and a performance improvement facilitator. The champion is expected to eliminate barriers in the implementation of the remedy. The process owner is

expected to lead the team. The facilitator is expected to assist the process owner in adhering to the IMPROVE format (Appendix A).

IMPROVE projects

IMPROVE projects are <u>focused</u> performance improvement projects that follow our IMPROVE methodology, which are identified by:

- Patients and families Through complaints, comments or patient satisfaction surveys.
- Care team members at all levels Through voluntarily occurrence reports (patient safety intelligence), from representatives on quality committee, culture of safety survey or employee engagement survey.
- o Senior Leadership When performance on goals falls below target
- External Benchmarks From review of quality / safety benchmark reports from external agencies or registries
- Regulatory Agencies and Healthcare Payors The Joint Commission, Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services, Department of Health and Environmental Control, and other Health Care Payors.

Before a project can become a formal IMPROVE project, it is brought before the Quality IMPROVE committee and approved as a project. This is done to ensure interdisciplinary assessment of the project in order to properly assign resources and expectations of completions. All projects are assigned a champion, a process owner, and a qualified facilitator.

QAPI Reports

Each ICCE and functional area has an active and high functioning QAPI. The QAPI is chaired by the ICCE Chief or quality designee. The purpose of the QAPI is to identify quality opportunities and close gaps. The QAPI should focus on 4 primary areas: (1) quality metrics that are publicly reported (2) quality metrics that are aligned with the strategic priorities of the unit (3) quality opportunities identified from a serious / sentinel event or regulatory survey (4) the creation, dissemination, and measurement of Value-based Ideal Care plans.

Strategic area quality reports

Other areas that are strategically important to the quality structure will also report to QEC, based on existing subcommittee infrastructure. Examples include Patient Safety, Infection Prevention, and the Value Institute.

MAJOR COMMITTEE GOVERNANCE:

The Board of Trustees:

The MUSC Board of Trustees is responsible of the quality of patient care provided. The Board of Trustees requires the medical staff to implement and report on the activities and mechanisms for monitoring, assessing and evaluating patient safety practices and the quality of patient care, for identifying and resolving problems and for identifying opportunities to improve patient care and services or performance throughout the facility.

The Board of Trustees is supported by the MUSC policies, Medical Staff Bylaws and this QAPI Plan. The MUSC Board of Trustees delegates and directs the Hospital Administration and the Medical Staff to:

- Recommend the strategic direction.
- Require reports and mechanisms for monitoring and evaluating the quality of patient care services to include the frequency of monitoring.
- Provide resources and support systems for performance improvement functions related to patient care services and safety.
- Require mechanisms to assure that all patients with the same health problem are receiving comparable levels of care in MUSC Health.
- Review information needed to educate the Board members about their responsibility for the guality and safety of patient care.
- Evaluate the Quality and Performance Improvement (QAPI) Plan every other year.

The Medical Executive Committee (MEC):

The MUSC Medical Center MEC is comprised of senior physician and administrative leadership from all components of the clinical enterprise. The MEC has responsibility for overseeing, supporting, and evaluating the quality and safety structure and outcomes. This committee is the structure that ensures medical staff leadership and involvement in performance improvement and that ensures coordination and accountability among department chairpersons, faculty, and residents. The MEC delegates the responsibility of physician performance improvement to the Department Chairpersons. More specifically, the purpose of the MEC is to ensure high quality, safe, patient-centered, cost-effective care throughout the MUSC's clinical enterprise.

The MUSC Health Quality Executive Committee (QEC):

The MUSC Health QEC, made up of senior leadership representing each of the ICCE units as well as other functional areas, oversees and coordinates the performance assessment and improvement activities within the organization. This group ensures that improvements are planned, designed, measured, analyzed, and sustained. More specifically, the QEC:

- Operationalizes improvement activities that are consistent with the MUSC Health Strategic Plan.
- Receives reports and acts on issues and initiatives that address each of the domains of quality.
- Uses performance data in the design and evaluation of new services or programs.
- Identifies improvement actions to be taken, assigns responsibility for each action, and ensures
 accountability for follow through.
- Oversees analyses of sentinel and serious safety events and ensures appropriate risk reduction strategies are implemented.
- Oversees organizational proactive risk assessment (example Failure Mode Effects and Analysis) and ensures appropriate risk reduction activities.
- Selects, prioritizes, and monitors the progress of the organization-wide quality improvement projects.
- Allocates financial resources necessary to support organization-wide quality improvement projects.
- Manages the flow of information to ensure effective communication and follow-up.
- Communicates performance assessment information and improvement activities to the MEC and MUSC Board of Trustees.
- Ensures that the quality and safety infrastructure meets regulatory standards.
- Supports QAPIs in meeting organizational goals

QAPI TEAMS:

Each ICCE unit and functional area at MUSC has a QAPI, whose mission is to achieve and surpass benchmarks for their specific area. Each QAPI is chaired by the ICCE Chief or relevant quality designee. Each QAPI regularly meets to review current performance and create-implement improvement plans to close any gaps in performance.

Specific Responsibilities:

- Ensure progress to closing identified gaps in performance for their area of responsibility.
- Develop improvement plans and remove barriers to effective action.
- Collaborate with other units/areas as needed.
- Report progress quarterly to QEC.
- Each QAPI team should focus on 4 primary areas:
 - o quality metrics that are publicly reported
 - o quality metrics that are aligned with the strategic priorities of the QAPI
 - o quality opportunities identified from a serious / sentinel event or regulatory survey
 - the creation, dissemination, and measurement of Value-based Ideal Care plans

The Quality Improve Committee:

The IMPROVE Committee is made up of senior leaders, administrators, directors, appropriate physician leaders, and performance improvement leadership and team members. This committees oversees the quality IMPROVE process and ensures that the process adheres to a standard quality improvement methodology. The Committee receives IMPROVE projects from the QEC, schedules timely review of the projects, ensures that the actions are appropriate to the identified problem and completed in a timely manner. The Committee makes recommendations to the QEC to modify the original charge if necessary, close out the project, or convert to a QAPI-related activity (or other governance group).

COMMUNICATION STRATEGIES:

Effectively communicating quality and safety performance horizontally and vertically is extremely important to ongoing engagement and improvement efforts. As such, the Quality and Safety structure has developed a repertoire of communication modalities and techniques

- Daily Check In (DCI): This is a daily communication modality to "look back" and "look ahead" for any threats to the safety or operations of the enterprise. Leaders from all areas gather information from area huddles and report out in "roll call" fashion to the DCI, then cascade any relevant information to their respective areas.
- Safety Rounds: These are weekly rounds by leaders from all support areas (safety, risk, infection
 prevention, IT, security, pharmacy, etc.) to front line in all areas, to identify and resolve any and
 all issues identified as threats to patient or care team safety. Many issues are resolved during
 rounds; others are assigned an "owner" and progress is reported back to the area leader to
 inform their team of progress being made on safety issues. In between rounds, issues can be
 communicated by anyone by email to: patientsafety@musc.edu.
- Safely Speaking: This is a daily email-based communication that covers an evidence-based tool, technique, innovation, or idea that can enhance patient or care team safety. The purpose is daily recognition and awareness of safety issues and efforts within the enterprise.
- Clinical connections: This is a weekly email-based communication modality that covers a qualitysafety section, with an intended audience of physician providers (including residents).
- GME: Quality reports are communicated to trainees and program directors at each and every monthly program director and chief resident meeting.
- Onboarding: Quality and safety education and operations are conveyed to each and every new care team member via their respective orientations (physicians, GME, leaders, and care team members).
- Other: Quality and safety reports are part of standing agenda items at each and every of the following meetings: Board of Trustees, Medical Executive Committee (MEC), Administrator-Director-Manager (ADM), and Physician Leader meetings.

PERFORMANCE IMPROVEMENT METHODOLOGY:

In an effort to continually improve organizational performance and maintain the safety and quality of patient care, MUSC Health evaluates the development of new processes as well as the redesign or improvement of existing processes. A systematic approach is utilized to:

- Problem solve, identify the new process or potential improvement.
- Assess/test the strategy for change.
- Analyze data from the test (to determine if the change produced the desired result).
- Implement the improvement strategy system-wide when applicable.
- Monitor for sustained change.

All improvement projects use the IMPROVE model described below, and are documented via the tools on the Performance Improvement web page and appendix A:

https://horseshoe.musc.edu/clinical/quality

MUSC Health also recognizes other standard quality improvement methodologies including LEAN and Six Sigma and ensures that the Performance Improvement Department has appropriate competencies in these areas.

SELECTION OF QUALITY IMPROVEMENT PRIORITIES:

Organizational quality improvement priorities are selected both proactively and in response to problems that are identified through ongoing assessment of data and analysis of adverse events. More specifically, the following sources of information are used to identify improvement opportunities:

- Strategic planning process
- Benchmark and other external comparative data
- Patient satisfaction data/complaints or concerns from patient-family advisory councils
- Employee concerns or complaints
- Occurrences, near misses and unsafe conditions from voluntary reporting
- Sentinel events
- Serious Safety events
- Other performance data from quality registries or benchmarking databases
- Common cause analyses from voluntary reporting
- Surveys of care team member engagement and culture of safety
- Risk areas or events from other organizations or entities
- Claims data
- Unit-identified concerns or system vulnerabilities
- Concerns or system vulnerabilities identified from any existing communication modalities (feedback from safety rounds, safely speaking, daily check in, unit huddles)
- Concerns or system vulnerabilities identified from mortality reviews
- Concerns identified through the compliance hotline or human resources

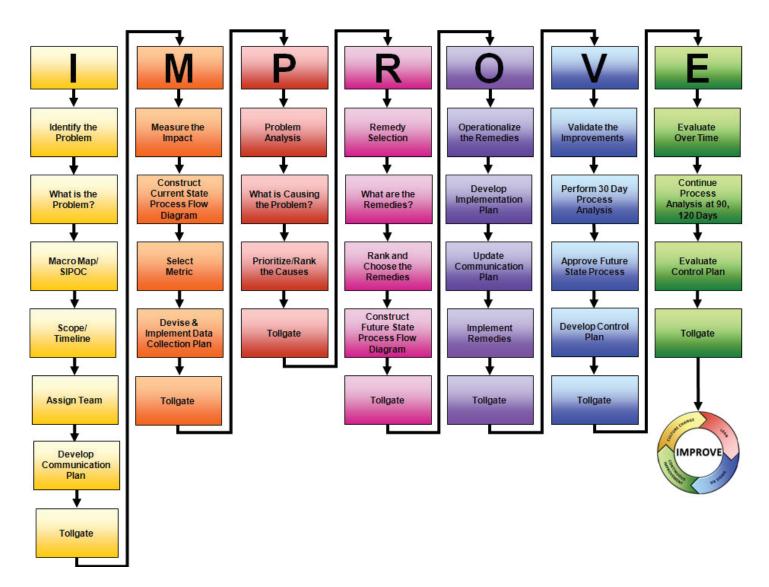

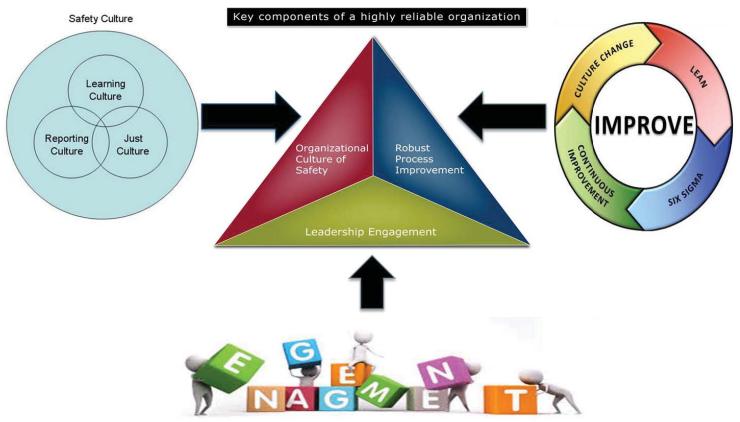
