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

Notes to the Interim Financial Statements

Statement of Revenues, Expenses and Changes in Net Assets: YTD December 31, 2022 (Unaudited)

Actuals Compared to Fixed Budget

Revenue Explanation: December year-to-date net patient service revenues were favorable to budget by 1.1%, or \$15.2M. Inpatient and outpatient surgeries were unfavorable to budget by 9.2% and 4.1%, respectively. Transplant procedures were unfavorable to budget by 10.8%. Case Mix Index was unfavorable \$3.4M and Payor Mix shift was favorable \$6.2M. Retail pharmacy revenues were favorable by \$44.9M. Other Revenues were \$7.8M unfavorable to budget.

Notes to the Interim Financial Statements – cont.

Statement of Revenues, Expenses and Changes in Net Assets: YTD December 31, 2022 (Unaudited)

Actuals Compared to Fixed Budget

Expense Explanation: The salary and benefit rate variance was unfavorable to budget by \$19.1M due to clinical staff vacancies driving the utilization of premium and contract labor. Benefits are favorable to budget \$10.0M.

Purchased Services were favorable to budget \$1.7M.

Physician Services were favorable to budget \$12.8M due to timing of expenses associated with College of Medicine.

Pharmaceuticals, not explained by volume, were unfavorable to budget by \$2.6M. Retail pharmacy revenues, net of expenses, were favorable to budget by \$22.3M.

Medical and Other Supplies, not explained by volume, were \$11.0M unfavorable to budget.


Utilities were unfavorable to budget by \$2.2M due to increase in electric rates and fuel costs.

Insurance was unfavorable to budget by \$0.9M.

Leases and Other were unfavorable to budget by \$2.9M due to increase in equipment rentals.

Unrestricted cash and cash equivalents decreased by \$25.6M from June 30, 2022. Significant FY2023 events decreasing cash include a \$25M payment to reduce accrued accounts payable, \$35M payroll processing ahead of schedule due to ERP implementation, and patient collections were \$53M less than forecasted.



BUDGET CHANGE REQUEST: This request is to increase the project budget by \$1,240,000. There have been significant escalations in the cost of construction and materials since the previous approval in April 2022. The predesign construction cost estimate provided for the feasibility study was based on a range between \$150 - \$200 per square foot for construction. After completion of the Schematic Design (SD) documents, the adjusted estimate received from Aiken Cost Consultants increased the cost per square foot to \$338. Pricing has been updated to reflect the RS Means 2022 cost database, current location factors, and market conditions and is their professional opinion of the probable cost of construction. The non-construction costs for this project have remained relatively stable from the previous estimate.

SCOPE OF WORK: This project primarily includes renovation of the existing ground floor of the College of Nursing Building on Jonathan Lucas Street to create flexible and multi-functional student-centric education and community spaces and collaborative research and practice hub conference spaces in support of the Nursing program's missions. The ground floor renovation consists of approximately 11,000 gross square feet and will include a new accessible lobby for the Nursing Building from Jonathan Lucas at the ground level and an interior stair for access to the 2nd floor. An existing skills lab on the 3rd floor is programmed to be relocated to the first floor and the existing space will then be repurposed to support faculty, staff, and student engagement and activities. The main lobby will feature collaborative gathering areas for the entire college as well as serve as pre-function space in support of the classroom and lecture spaces and can be used during break-out sessions. The renovation will include a 1,700 square foot lecture-type hall that can be subdivided into smaller lecture rooms, two 375 square foot classrooms that can be combined to a single classroom, a 600 square foot sub-dividable research hub, and a 1,200 square foot multifunctional common area adjacent to a kitchen to support CON workforce and student community and engagement, workshops, conferences, and professional meetings. The renovation will include state-of-the-art AV systems and technologies to support in-person and remote instruction.

JUSTIFICATION: To adequately accommodate growth in student numbers; meet AACN accreditation requirements for curriculum content; and support a pipeline of qualified nurses in South Carolina - all through innovative, competency-based training in a modern learning environment - it is imperative that our College strategically expand the utilization of space within our current building. Addressing these key objectives is critical to our continued growth and sustainability.





Note 8. Summary of Net Position

The University implemented GASB Statement No. 68, *Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions* in fiscal year 2015 and GASB Statement No. 75, *Accounting and Financial Reporting for Post Employment Benefits Other Than Pensions (OPEB)* in fiscal year 2018. These statements require participating employers to report their proportionate share of the plans' net pension liability and OPEB liabilities, pension and OPEB expense and deferred outflows and inflows. In fiscal year 2022, excluding the GASB 68 and GASB 75 impact, the University's unrestricted net position increased \$39.6 million for a total of \$200.2 million. In fiscal year 2021, excluding the GASB 68 and GASB 75 impact, the University's net position increased \$2.3 million for a total of \$160.6 million. In fiscal year 2020, excluding the GASB 68 and GASB 75 impact, the University's unrestricted net position decreased \$7.1 million for at total of \$158.3 million. In fiscal year 2019, excluding the GASB 68 and GASB 75 impact, the University's unrestricted net position increased \$28.2 million for a total of \$165.4 million.
